Neve Redman - J.A.S.O.N "Just a Sea of Neglect"

I spent an hour collecting rubbish along the foreshore on Stockton Beach during the holidays as part of the Waste to Art workshop run by ReNewy Newcastle and Newcastle City Council. My family used to live in Stockton and my grandparents have a strong connection to the area.

It was surprising how much waste we could find on what is a pretty clean beach. We found everything from lollipop sticks, lost toys and water bottles, and unfortunately, a used nappy. Along the beach was also a lot of coal pieces and broken glass that has been tumbled in the sea.

It is really sad to see what ends up in our ocean and is left on the beach by people. I recently visited Birubi beach at the other end of Stockton Beach in Port Stephens. These beaches are spectacular and such a drawcard for this area. We are so lucky to live here and should be caring for the beach and the ocean.

Using driftwood and some of the rubbish pieces I found, I was inspired to make a sculpture that turns waste into art. This beach has been a part of my childhood, so I styled my piece like a child's mobile. Attendance

As part of our current school plan, we have been working towards improving attendance across our school. This term we had a focus on improving attendance with more of a whole class focus. Classes have been working towards earning a reward for high attendance, on time, every day. While we have seen some improvement, no class has achieved all their stickers yet. Remember, you can help by notifying the office of absences through the Sentral Parent Portal. If you're running late, a quick phone call before 9am will help as well.

Next term, we will monitoring our individual student attendance data more closely. Our aim for student attendance is 95% or above, as every day away is learning time lost. We will be implementing a new monitoring process to identify and work with families to improve attendance where a student is attending 85% of the time or less. This will involve initial contact from a class teacher or executive, working together to identify any barriers to attendance, further monitoring and communication, and of course celebrating success.

Cutlery


As we strive to create a safe and sustainable environment for our children, we kindly ask that you pack cutlery from home for your child when it is needed.

Minister's 2024 Christmas Card Competition



Search for Cunjevoi or "sea squirt", Port Jackson shark egg cases, cuttlefish, crabs, beautiful shells like limpets and zebra shells as well as sponges and algae.

Look out for Bottlenose dolphins as they are often seen off the rock shelves swimming and playing in large groups. You may even be lucky enough to spot a whale from the shoreline.
