We are excited to announce the finalists for this year, who will represent our school at the upcoming Zone Public Speaking Competition next term:

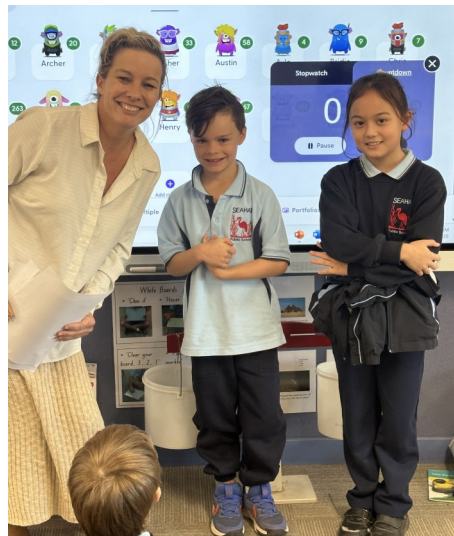

Stage 3 CPR

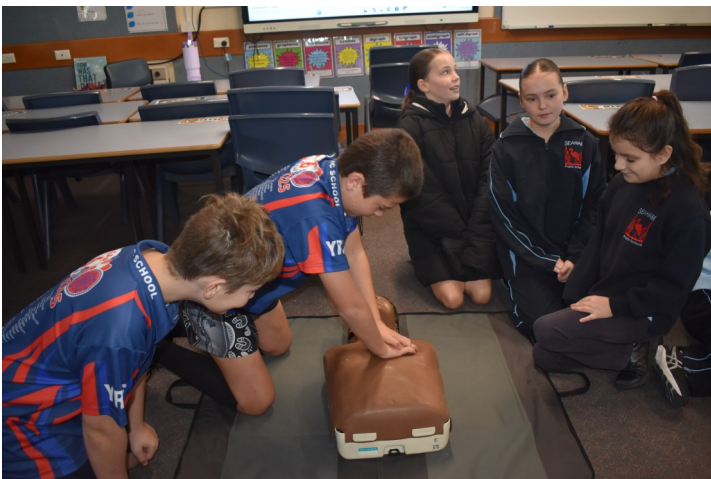
At the start we learnt the 5 steps of CPR. Then learnt who the most important person in CPR is and got told it might not always work but try your best. Then we got told what numbers to ring if you're on your own, 000 and if that doesn't work 112. Remember that $1+1=2$.

If someone asks to get a defibrillator he showed us what it looks like. He showed us the recovery position and neutral position.

He showed us what CPR stand for. He explained that we need to do 30 compressions and 2 rescue breaths, and showed us what DRSABCD stands for. He showed us how to do CPR on an adult, a child and a baby.

Then all students got into groups and practiced CPR on fake people while he came around and corrected us in case we were doing something wrong. At the end he asked questions to make sure we listened and understood CPR.
