Principal's Message

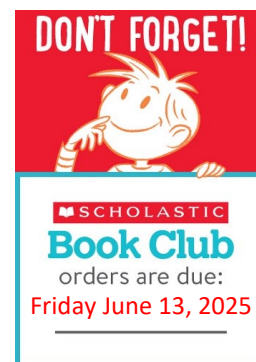
Hello to our wonderful Seaham community and welcome to week seven. We hope you have had a fantastic week. Thank you to our community for your continued support.
